

The seventh edition of Echo Echo's acclaimed international Festival of Dance and Movement took place in November 2019 including a programme of over 36 performance and participation events reaching over 1,100 people. The Festival has now presented the work of over 270 artists over its first seven years.

Fourth Festival All-Ireland Outreach Programme in partnership with six dance venues around the island and supported by Irish Department of Culture and Dance Ireland, offered six Artist Bursaries to support members of the Irish dance community, north and south, to attend Echo Echo Festival in November 2019.

Participation and Partnerships Programme 2019/20

Echo Echo offers a diverse programme of workshops and courses to suit all abilities and levels of engagement including regular classes for children and adults of all ages. The company's participation and education events serve thousands of participants each year and work in partnership with many different groups. The following are just a few examples from over 100 different programmes in 2019/20.

Body Wisdom - Echo Echo's long-running project for over-50s has grown to become a very committed core group of members who meet regularly, create movement and poetry, and perform publicly - as well as being a constant source of support and inspiration to the Echo Echo team.

"Since joining the Body Wisdom class I have written hundreds of thousands of words (imposing many of them on my long suffering Colleagues in Body Wisdom) praising the system of poetic movement taught at Echo Echo. Children In Need - Echo Echo artists worked in partnership with Children In Need for the 2nd year of a 2 year performance project with disadvantaged primary aged children. The project engaged children from St Michael's PS, St Paul's PS, Drumachose PS, and St Eugene's PS in 15-17 weekly dancing and drumming sessions, which worked towards a sharing performance in front of an audience.

Arts and Older People

Echo Echo continued their successful partnership with ACNI Arts and Older People fund into its 4th year. The project delivered 15 Poetic Movement and Mindfulness workshops in both Praxis Care and Strabane Community Project. These organisations supply services to some of the most disadvantaged older people in Derry/Strabane council area. The project reached more than 40 participants helping to tackle issues of isolation and Ionliness and increase health and well-being.

Good Relations - Echo Echo produced a 10-week cross community project 'Watch our Shared Space Move' with support from DCSDC Good Relations Fund. This brought together over 50 P5 and P6 children from Newbuildings PS and St Columba's PS for a special movement and drumming performance project. Four local primary schools visited Echo Echo Studios to view 'Without' and take part in a movement workshop during Good Relations Week 2019.

"I couldn't believe the difference in some of the children in my class who had difficulty with co-ordination and who pre-workshop would have struggled with confidence and self-esteem. Echo Echo Contact Improvisation Festival 2019

After the resounding success of Echo Echo's first Contact Improvisation Festival in 2018 the 2nd edition was produced on 24th - 31st May 2019. As the only CI festival on the island of Ireland, the 2019 programme offered a rich and varied week of participation focussed intensives, classes and jams delivered by a host of renowned international contact teachers and movement artists: Mirva Mäkinen (Finland), Steve Batts (Northern Ireland), Robert Anderson (England), Yulia Bodrova (Russia), Miguel Silva (Portugal/Ibiza), Jöerg Göenner (Germany), Aureli Oslé (Spain/Ireland) , Olek Wójcik, Ayesha Mailey and Kelly Quigley (Northern Ireland), Elise Nuding (Sweden/Ireland), Karen Cassidy (Northern Ireland). Over 40 people of all ages and levels of experience participated in the festival, with around a quarter of them travelling from outside the UK/Ireland. A special pre-festival CI Weekend Workshop was offered at DanceHouse, Dublin in partnership with Contact Improvisation Ireland.
